

Numbers

In writing, numbers are used to communicate a variety of information. This includes currency, dates, percentages, and order of importance. Although there is no standard for using numbers in all styles of writing, here are some general guidelines.

Spell out:

Numbers between zero and nine
Indefinite amounts
General time periods
Common fractions
Universally accepted usage
Fractions less than one

three, eight
millions of people, over **one billion**
the **Sixties**, the **fifteenth** century
one-fifth of the class, a **two-thirds** majority
the **Twelve** Apostles, the **Five** Pillars of Islam
two-thirds, nine-tenths

Use numerals for:

Decimals
Divisions in books
Addresses
Specific dates
Fractions greater than one
Numbers 10 and up

Chapter **3**, pages **43-90**
11 Maple Lane
January **23, 2011**, the **21st** of May
1 ½, 2 ¾
23, 537

Both numerals and words can be used for:

Time of day: **6:00** a.m.; **5:30** p.m.; **six** o'clock
Large numbers: **88 hundred, 7 thousand, 203 million, 5 dozens**

Exceptions to these rules:

Use numerals when grouping a number between zero and nine with a larger number.

- *Example:* Only **8** out of **40** people attended the meeting today.

Use numerals when writing a precise measurement or mathematical function.

- *Examples:* **4** cm wide, the remaining **7%**, the **9th** trial, a ratio of **16:1**

Spell out numbers that begin a sentence, title, or text heading.

- *Example:* **Forty-eight** out of **70** people voted for the bylaw.
